Liaison: We liaise with a wide range of organisations, including Addingham Parish Council, Bradford Council and the many and varied village groups and societies as well as national and regional civic bodies.

The Society is a member of Civic Voice, the national body for the Civic Society movement and the Yorkshire and Humberside Association of Civic Societies .

How the Society was formed: In the 1970s a Residents' Action Group opposed plans for rubbish tipping on the outskirts of the village. Following this success the Civic Society was formed in 1978 as a registered charity. Its first aim at the time was to provide a voice for the village in helping to determine the most suitable route for the Addingham by-pass. Since then the Society has grown and developed its range of activities. The following pages describe some of our work.
