Parish Council News

Over the past 12 months, Addingham Parish Council has been working hard, acting on your behalf to maintain and improve our village facilities and amenities, ensuring Addingham remains a wonderful place to live, work and visit. Whilst the role of a Parish Councillor is voluntary, all eleven of your elected councillors are fully committed to playing their part – from assessing planning matters to managing recreation areas, liaising with local and national bodies and organising key public events. Here's a roundup of key achievements, what we're currently working on and our vision for the future.



What a relief!

Recently, one of our proudest accomplishments is the reopening of an essential service for village residents and visitors alike - the village public toilet at Sugar Hill. After vandalism forced its closure over 20 months ago, it has been completely refurbished at a cost of £67k funded by The Parish Council. Now fully accessible and designed to withstand further vandalism, though let's hope that was a one off, the facility operates with a contactless card payment system, costing just 30p to use.

Maintenance issues across the village need to be handled quickly and efficiently. To that end, we have invested in additional equipment that will mean we'll keep Addingham looking its best.



Another major improvement was the re-roofing of the War Memorial/Bowling Club. Along with this, we installed beautiful new outdoor lighting, which gives the War Memorial the respect and prominence it deserves. We hope you'll agree that this has made a significant difference, adding to the dignity and grandeur of this important site.

Ongoing Resilience

We have recently been gifted a storage unit, which will play a key role in our **Addingham Emergency Resilience Plan**. Over the coming months, we will be

working to camouflage the unit so that it blends seamlessly with its surroundings. This space will allow us to store vital equipment, ensuring we are prepared to respond effectively in case of emergencies.

Maintenance remains a key priority for the Parish Council and we continue to assess and address any areas in need of attention. If you spot something that requires maintenance or repair, we encourage you to reach out to us as we welcome your input in keeping our village in great shape.

Future Plans

Looking ahead, we have an exciting vision for the area outside the Sugar Hill facility. We would love to develop this space into a community bandstand; it's a project that will require careful planning, grant applications and community support. Although a longer-term initiative, we believe it has the potential to create a fantastic focal point for village events and gatherings.

Please don't hesitate to get in touch with the Parish Council with any suggestions, concerns, or ideas for future projects. Why not volunteer your services too? As always, we are committed to serving the people of Addingham and ensuring that our village continues to thrive. Thank you for your continued support. We look forward to another productive year!

We have three Grade I listed buildings in the village – St Peter's Church and two listings for Farfield Hall. We also have a Grade II* listed building, the Friend's Quaker Meeting House.








These are amongst the 120 listed buildings in Addingham and their sheer variety may come as a surprise! Listings include houses, cottages, barns, bee-boles, farmhouses, a dovecote, tombs, a mausoleum, telephone kiosks, milestones, a mounting block, a wool-comber's shop and public houses. Some, but only some, of these have been photographed and are available to look at on the Addingham Photo Archive. Knowing that there are many gaps, the Heritage Group has set itself the task of ensuring that there is a far more comprehensive collection of available images of our listed buildings. Here at Addingham Surgery, we carefully plan for each flu season to ensure that we can provide vaccinations for all our patients who need them. This includes purchasing influenza vaccines in advance.

Each year, we base our orders on anticipated demand using the most recent vaccine programme as a guide. This ensures we have sufficient supply for the next vaccination campaign as it can be difficult to top up orders once one has been placed.

However, when patients book appointments for their flu vaccination but do not attend or choose to have their vaccine somewhere other than Addingham Surgery, it creates a challenge. Vaccines that are ordered but unused represent both a financial cost to the surgery and where a patient fails to attend, a lost opportunity to protect someone from the flu. This waste also impacts our ability to efficiently allocate resources and meet the needs of our community.

How you can help

- 1. **Keeping Your Appointment** If you've booked a flu vaccination, please make every effort to attend your appointment.
- 2. Receiving Your Influenza Vaccination at the Surgery these have been purchased in advance and will go to waste if not used.

An Offcumden Recalls . . .



I arrived in Addingham, from Birmingham, to Ivydean, 3 Southfield Villas, at the age of four in 1940. My earliest memories are watching the searchlights and anti-aircraft shells exploding in the night sky over Birmingham and maybe Coventry in the distance, and father and uncle Jim digging a hole at the bottom of the garden to erect an air raid shelter. Shortly after that Uncle Jim disappeared into what I now know was the Royal Engineers and he was not to be seen again until the end of the war.

My older brother Anthony and I travelled up to Yorkshire seated on a settee in the back of a small furniture van while my mother and father followed on behind in a tiny Austin 7 car. In the pre

motorway days this was probably a 6hr trip and we duly arrived at lvydean, 3 Southfield Villas where we lived for the next 2 or so years.



Father, as foreman electrician for the Rover Car Company, had been sent along with a team of electricians and engineers, to convert the velvet weaving shop at Low Mills, Addingham into an engineering shop and tool room to replace those in danger of being bombed in

the raids on Coventry. I believe carburettors for aircraft were produced and other parts vital to the war effort.

I presume our house was commandeered by the government and we had 2 or 3 electricians lodging with us, with my mother acting as housekeeper. After the war my father eventually started Pearce Bros. Electrical Contractors and got the work reinstalling the velvet weaving looms. We stayed in Addingham and have lived in the village to this day.



To the rear of Ivydean was the railway goods yard and engine shed, roughly where Southfield House is now. At the front I recall the open fields where I watched the local Home Guard on training exercises. On one occasion I remember them digging a small trench half way down the east side of the steps to the suspension bridge to set up a machine gun post to defend the bridge. The last time I looked the remains of the earthworks were still visible..


My uncle James Pearce, served with the 8th Army, making his way from Cairo all the way up through Italy and survived to join my father as a partner in Pearce Bros.

I know of only a handful of people today who would know I am an offcummden (my apologies if I have left any one out!): Beryl Falkingham nee Turnpenny,

Margret Holmes nee Ashton, Raymond Fisher, Norman Mole.


