Parish Council News

Neighbourhood Plan Review

Our Neighbourhood Plan is a vital tool in helping us manage future development in the parish. The Parish Council has decided to review the Plan to make sure it remains relevant and if needed, to update it in line with Bradford's Core Strategy. This review will be an important opportunity for the whole community to have a say in shaping the future of our village. Summer Events

This year's **Addingham Gala** benefitted from excellent weather and the Parish Council was pleased to work with volunteers to coordinate the road closure, helping to keep costs down. A big thank you goes to all the volunteers and to the Gala Committee for putting on another successful event. Congratulations are also in order for the participants and organisers of this year's **AAGA Open Gardens**, part of BD25 City of Culture, which raised over £9,000 for Manorlands. An incredible achievement. Well done to everyone involved!

Village Improvements



We continue to invest in village facilities:

- **Benches** will be gradually replaced across the parish as funds allow.
- The lighting on the MUGA has been upgraded.
 The lights will now be available free of charge during certain hours and can also be booked through the Clerk.
- New heating has been installed in the Scout Hall at the Pavilion, making it a more comfortable venue for local groups.
- A beautiful iron gate has been added at the entrance to the pétanque court and path to the play area.

Civic Society News



Gill Battarbee here, Chair of Addingham Civic Society (ACS).

As many of you will know the Civic Society has four key themes, **Planning, Heritage, Environment and Community.** In this edition we are focussing on **Planning**. With the national focus on housebuilding there are going to be plenty of significant issues to keep our Planning group busy.


Addingham's housing allocation is currently a minimum of 180 houses over the next 15 years, but with the various pressures on housing numbers this is likely to be increased in the next Bradford Local Plan.

The Local Plan identifies the housing allocations for the area. However the Bradford Local Plan, like many other authorities, has suffered numerous delays due to the change of government, new legislation etc. and its adoption is **not now projected until 2028!** This means that in the interim, developers can submit speculative housing applications which Bradford will have to approve unless it has some very convincing overriding reason to reject them.

The Introduction of the Grey Belt Our situation is compounded by the introduction of "Grey Belt" land. This refers to Green Belt land that was previously developed or does not strongly support some of the key purposes of Green Belt designation. If plots of land are redesignated from Green to Grey they can be allocated for housing. For example, a recent planning application for 9 houses off Turner Lane was approved by Bradford Planning Department. The success of this application was based on this relatively new legislation, permitting a green belt site to be redesignated as grey and therefore acceptable for housing development. Since then an outline planning application has been lodged for 27 houses at the top of Moor Lane on what is currently Green Belt land. This application is justified by the claim that it should be reclassified as Grey Belt. In addition, Bradford is vulnerable to applications on current Green Belt land because of its lack of a 5 year planned housing bank. Until the Local Plan (2028!) is in place individual applications like these are likely to continue.

Addingham Neighbourhood Plan is an important document for the village and must

be applied in planning decisions. It will continue to be relevant until it is superseded by a new Neighbourhood Plan or the new Local Plan. A copy of the Neighbourhood Plan



can be found in The Hub and on The Parish Council Website. Our Planning group will also be supporting the upcoming Parish Council Neighbourhood Plan Review.

Planning applications for Addingham are lodged with Bradford Council. Local Councils, neighbours and residents are then informed about the applications via, letters, public notices and the press. Details about applications can be found on the Bradford Council Planning Portal website where comments can also be lodged.

Please be engaged and share your views. They are vital!

Beamsley Stretcher Race Charity Fundraiser



In a remarkable twist of fate Addingham neighbours Rowan Sutcliffe and Ryan Womersley have discovered they share more than just living three doors apart – they've both been diagnosed with incredibly rare forms of the same cancer, sarcoma.

Rowan, 20, who's studying building surveying, was diagnosed in 2023 with primary cardiac angiosarcoma, an incredibly rare condition (only c. 164 cases of angiosarcoma annually!) meaning an aggressive tumour in the right atrium of his heart. Treatment meant chemo, then radio therapy, then successful open-heart surgery.


Ryan, an ex Royal Marine, who now runs his own education company for international students, was diagnosed with perineal epithelioid sarcoma, an aggressive soft tissue

cancer, in March 2025. There are just 19 cases of epithelioid sarcoma every year in England!

Diagnosed after an MRI scan for a lump, which wasn't painful and left medics baffled, Ryan, 32, had pelvic surgery in April and then radiotherapy, to remove and treat a 5cm tumour. Ryan says: "Sarcoma is not common and can be overlooked. Rowan's mother, Emma, suggested that when I was fit and well that we should do

an event to fundraise for Sarcoma UK so hopefully on October 25th we can raise funds to help raise awareness and boost research to help others who are affected by sarcoma."

Ryan is recruiting Royal Marine excolleagues to be stretcher bearers for the two-team race up and down our very own 1,300ft Beamsley Beacon! Villagers will take turns to lie on the stretchers during the 10km event raising funds for charity Sarcoma UK. Ryan is taking part though Rowan, who now wears a pacemaker, is not.

infamous Burma to Thailand Railway – the "Death Railway".

By contrast, a donated school photograph of smartly dressed smiling boys and girls revealed how, alongside those unimaginable horrors, normal life ran in parallel here in Addingham in 1945.

This year we have also held heritage walks as part of BD25 City of Culture and been promoting our activities and Addingham as a historic village to visit at the recent Yorkshire Heritage Summit.

Addingham Garden Friends



Passing up and down Main Street you may have noticed earlier this year considerable activity at the Cottages Garden – opposite Beckside Close and the Council Car Park.

This garden is the site of four houses that were demolished in the 1960's and which the Garden Friends have for some years maintained for the Parish Council and Bradford Council. We had been having problems in wet weather with the slippery nature of the stone paving causing accidents. The "crazy" paving also required frequent



weeding which gets a bit wearing on the hands and knees and is very time consuming!

So we've made some changes including putting down a safer, more attractive and easier maintenance surface whilst at the same time making the garden better for disabled access. We also weeded out a few shrubs that had got old and very woody and, in their stead, have introduced new planting.

The great community nature of Addingham has made this possible: The Beer Festival and The Civic Society very generously gave us grants for the materials and hire plant, volunteers from the Addingham Allotments and Gardens Society helped us with the labouring, the Parish Council helped us with approvals for the changes from Bradford Council and Cllr Michael Flesher agreed to take away the substantial volume of stone that we had to lift, together with those who took stone away to use for themselves!









The photographs show the work in action and the fruits of our labours which we hope

make the garden a great place to come and sit in and enjoy.

Stewart Taylor writes: Our annual Village Show, always the focal point of our events calendar, was held in August and what a fabulous event it was! In the weeks leading up to the Show we put out a challenge to our growers and crafters for 400 entries and we smashed it, with a grand total of 485 exhibits across the 63 classes, easily filling the available space in the Mem Hall, ranging from horticultural produce to handicrafts, baking, photography, flowers and floral art, dedicated children's classes, and even growing the longest runner bean!

All the exhibits were judged by invited experts in their various fields and, by their own admission, their work was not made at all easy by the high quality of entries on display, which really did show off the skill and craft that exists in our local community. It's difficult to pick out any one particular class, there were so many outstanding entries to admire, though a special mention to the photography classes: 46 entries in total, and each individual entry received detailed, constructive feedback from our local expert and judge, John Fontana. Now that's what I call added value!

At the closing ceremony the prize winners were awarded their trophies by Bill Preston, a life member and former chair and president of our Association.

I'll leave the last word to our Show Secretary, Peter Cooke, who very quietly and unassumingly makes it all happen: 'This is our third annual Show we've staged since regrouping post Covid and without doubt the best one yet. Our entries were over 50% up on last year, the exhibits were of outstanding quality and I can't thank our local community enough for supporting this traditional village event. My sincere thanks also to the judges, exhibitors, local business sponsors and our behind-the-scenes volunteers who worked so hard to ensure everyone had a memorable day'.

It's been a busy year, as always!

In Waste Week (March) we organised a Jumble Trail, highlighting the importance of re-using things rather than throwing them away. Our next one will be in May 2027.

In Wildlife Week (June) we launched our new Moorside

Connections Walk. It was also one of our contributions to Bradford City of Culture 2025.

In Water Week (July) we hand-delivered a leaflet about using water wisely to every house in the village. It was designed jointly with and paid for by Yorkshire Water.

And in **Zero Carbon Week (September)** we also hand-delivered a leaflet, on how to reduce our carbon footprint, to every house. It was designed by local resident Henry Makin.

Now we are looking forward to closing off the year with our annual village meeting:

"How green is our village 2025" Saturday 15th November in the Memorial Hall, 2 – 5.30 pm

It's an opportunity for everyone to come together from across the village and talk about their green activities. There will be displays, short presentations and two talks.

The first will be by Kath Clark from the Bradford Council Sustainability Team. She will talk about the **Bradford Climate Action plan**. We have asked her to explain what the plan means for us, what help the Council can provide to local communities such as ours



and how we can all work together towards the common goal of reducing our environmental footprint and protecting nature in our region. The second talk, by Alex Evans will be on "Climate Conversations". Alex will argue that we don't talk about climate change to our friends and neighbours as much as we should. He believes such conversations can be very powerful in helping us all adopt the environmentally-friendly new technologies and lifestyles that are needed to reach **net zero**. But we do need to be trained!

Wow!! 3rd August 2025 will go down as a defining day for our club as Addingham won the Waddilove Cup for the first time in the club's history by beating 2024 winners Horsforth Hall Park by 17 runs in a well-contested final held at Ilkley Cricket Club. There were great contributions from across the team with Addingham's Nick Farrell being named Man of the Match

The day was always going to be special as we have to go back to 1987 and 1988 for our only previous appearances, as beaten finalists mind, in the league's premier cup competition. There was a real belief that this year's final was going to be different, having progressed through after a very close, intense semi-final against Saltaire CC.



Many villagers that follow us have noted over the past few seasons we've put together a very strong and talented team, which saw the side promoted to Airedale Wharfedale Senior Cricket League Premier Division this season after winning the first division title in style the previous year.

It is a team in the true sense of the word, moulded and led by the captain Rick Atkins, where every player counts and contributes.

The success on the field is fantastic. 

Rector Mark Cannon writes: Church Makeover?



In the next few months we hope to put out some new plans for the church interior, and we want feedback from the village. It is never easy to make changes to a building which many people remember as a place of weddings, funerals and christenings, but we have known for some time that the church is not all that accessible for those with mobility issues. and we want to make the church easier to enter, and to stay in. Part of this involves opening up spaces around the

doors and in one aisle. **We want a more flexible space** and the removal of some of the pews would allow us to make room for wheelchairs, walkers and pushchairs etc. It would also give us more facilities for meetings and activities.

Our proposals are going to be published soon, and we will also hold a formal public consultation. It would be good to hear what you think. The church council believes that a modest re-order would bring many benefits, and we'd welcome your views.

And we haven't been thinking just about the building, we have also been looking at how to welcome visitors when they step into our church. How welcome does a visitor feel? We know we can do some bits well, but we know also that others have been let down. Can we be a church where you feel a sense of community and fellowship? We might be able to alter the building but changing hearts is another challenge altogether.



We're almost at the end of our ninth year, so 2026 will be our tenth anniversary year! We're marking it with a concert by the Skipton Brass Band who have kindly offered to play for us to raise money for an environmental project in the village. You are cordially invited!

Addingham Environment Group 10th Anniversary Concert Skipton Brass Band - Saturday 21st March 2026

Our 10th Anniversary provides us with an opportunity to reflect on our successes and failures so far in tackling climate change and wildlife loss at the village scale.

We'll be putting together our story over the next few months documenting our work: organising jumble trails, litter-picking green spaces, running a pop-up stall for refills, planting trees and hedges, creating wildflower mini-meadows, keeping an eye on our becks, creating wildlife ponds, surveying homes with our thermal imaging camera, controlling invasive species and monitoring our bird, bee, butterfly and (from this year) bat populations.

More than anything we're proud of our AEG community, now over 350 strong, with almost 100 actively involved in village projects, many coming out on Saturday mornings all year round, restoring, protecting, monitoring and managing our green and blue spaces.

There are hard yards to come. The next ten years will be crucial in determining nationally whether we can achieve "net zero" by 2050. But it's good to see that through the auspices of Climate Action



Addingham (CAA) firmly supported by the Parish Council and the Civic Society, many of our village community groups are now signed up to the need to live more sustainably and that over 90% of our residents believe that if we all play our part we can make a difference. We have to keep going, there's no planet B!

Going Electric



Thinking about getting an EV but nowhere to charge it?

CoCharger is a Community Charging App. that enables **Hosts**, people who have their own home charger, to 'rent' their charger out when it isn't in use (which is most of the time!). All you need to do as an EV owner with the charger, is sign up as a **Chargee** and look for your nearest neighbourhood Host. The app handles all the payments, communication and bookings between you. Doesn't owning an EV now appear a more viable option?

There are currently 2 Hosts in Addingham (and I happen to be one!) My charger has bags of free time for others to use at a very reasonable rate and I am planning to recruit others in a

similar position to me to give a wider spread around the village.

Existing EV Owners: is your EV charger idle most of the time? Now imagine if it could make you a bit of cash...! The CoCharger App means you

can make your EV charger available (for a fee) to others who don't have their own. You simply sign up as a Host on the app, you then set your own charging rate, add your bank details and then the app, handles everything else between you and Chargees.

If you would like to know more do give me a call, or simply download the CoCharger app. from the Google Play store or Apple App store. Let's enable more households to own an Electric Vehicle!
