# Welcome to Addingham Civic Society

**The Society Today:** The Society is open to anyone who lives in the village and its environs. Over the years it has grown and currently has approximately 400 members.

*Liaison:* We liaise with a wide range of organisations, including Addingham Parish Council, Bradford Council, and the many and varied village groups, as well as regional societies and civic bodies. The Society is a member of the Yorkshire and Humberside Association of Civic Societies.

How the Society was formed: In the 1970's a Residents' Action Group successfully opposed plans for tipping on the outskirts of the village. Following this success, the Civic Society was formed in 1978 as a registered charity. Its first aim at the time was to provide a voice for the village in helping determine the most suitable route for the Addingham by-pass. Since then, the Society has grown, developed and diversified its range of activities. The following pages describe some of our work.

**The Trustees:** The Society is a charity and is managed by a board of Trustees who meet monthly. There are also sub-groups including Finance, Planning, Environment, Heritage and Social Activities. - ♦ Encourage the involvement and interest of individuals and educational or other organisations, from the village and beyond, in these aims.


## Addingham Photo Archive

## The Planning Group
