



#### **Methodist Church Hall Updates**

Premises Sale Update September 2025



Chapel Street, Addingham

Following a period of discernment the decision to sell our current building and site was made in May 2023. The primary reasons behind the decision to sell, include the state of disrepair particularly the need to re-roof, the age profile of the congregation and that current projections predict a cash deficit within the near future.

Prior to the premises being marketed we had provided the reasons for the decision to sell to the Parish Council, our Hall User Groups and the Civic Society and have provided updates.

Following authorisation from the Trustees for Methodist Church Purposes, and to comply with Bradford Council Planning criteria, the premises have been marketed for Community Use for a 12-month period since 28th June 2024 but no bids have been forthcoming.

Separately, we were advised by Bradford Council on 3<sup>et</sup> April 2025 that a local charity had nominated our premises as an Asset of Community Value. The application was approved allowing a Moratorium Period during which an intention to bid for the premises could be registered. On 30<sup>th</sup> July Bradford Council confirmed that it had received no notification from a local eligible charity group of an intention to make a bid for the property and that "you are free to dispose of the property as you wish".

To ensure that we continue to comply with the requirements of the Charity Commission we are working with our selling agent to ensure our ability to dispose of the premises as soon as legally possible. This includes the submission of a Pre-Application Enquiry to Bradford Council to explore change of use options for the premises.

In the meantime, we continue to explore how and where within the village we can continue to worship and witness as a Methodist presence in our community, but not as property owners.

#### **Addingham Parish Footpaths**

Footpaths perform an important part of our heritage in Addingham. From the boundaries to the south on Addingham Moorside to the north at Farfield, and from the west at Marchup on Silsden Road to the east at Cocking End, signposts and waymarking (yellow arrows on a white background) define clearly where our rights of way exist.

Footpaths were often created in times past by isolated farming communities across the Moorside whose only realistic way of getting to the village was by walking. Thus developed a network of paths that still exist today. The Dales Way, which runs from Ilkley to Bowness in the Lake District, passes through our parish and remains ever popular. Bradford Council is responsible for maintenance issues which are carried out by the Countryside Service with which we usually have an excellent relationship.

The Definitive Map shows where Public Rights of Way exist and is a statutory document conclusive in law and alterable only by legal order. Bradford Council therefore has the obligation to maintain our local footpaths; it makes sense to consult and agree with land- owners, local residents and other user groups such as The Ramblers thus avoiding dispute and confrontation.

Catsteps, Cuckoo Nest, Nudge Hill, the Roman Fort, Small Banks — can you locate them on the local OS Map, or more likely nowadays by using Google Maps or one of the numerous walking apps? Do you know where the Millstone Quarry is, or the Quaker Meeting House? If physically able, visit these places on foot. Local publications appeared pre- bypass in the early '90s with Alison Armstrong's Country Walks Around Addingham, A Landscape through History, updated in 1998, and more recently in our President Don Barrett's book, Walks Around Addingham, which can be purchased from the Civic Society or Amazon. A self-guided walk on the Moorside (Environment Group) and an Addingham Geology Trail (Will Varley) may interest you too.

The Blue Plaque Trail, very much an important part of our village heritage, essentially stays within village boundaries including High and Low Mill and can easily be walked in sections over several outings at a leisurely pace. Our Society will advise on all these.

#### Help to identify the Addingham Birds

Following our July Speaker Meeting in which Chris Acomb outlined the variety of birds that we see in Addingham, a member suggested that I let people know about a particularly good Bird App for your smart phone.

It is called **Merlin**, and the app logo looks like this.

The app is free and is run by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology.

The great thing is that this app helps you identify birds.

Users can record bird sounds, upload photos, or answer simple questions about size, colour, and behaviour to get a list of likely species. The app provides detailed information including photos, sounds, range maps, and expert tips, and it can track your sightings to create a personalised bird list.
